<p>Learning Strategy</p>	<p><i>For pre-course assignment, the participants of the course would be offered with self-learning materials – European legislation, recommendations and frameworks, actual researches etc. on the main topics of the course. The learning material would be shared online via LMS.</i></p> <p><i>The course itself (online learning phase) will consist of 12 hours of theoretical learning consisting of lectures provided by national and international experts in the field. After the presentations the participants will have a space for round table discussions and doubts clarification.</i></p> <p><i>For the self-training phase the participants would be offered with post-course learning materials, especially presentations prepared for course needs, which would be available for sharing. Two weeks after attending the course the participants would be ask to fulfil a questionnaire compiled by the organizing country. To prepare themselves to fulfil the questionnaire the participants should have at least 10 hours self-training.</i></p> <p><i>The organizer expects that all pre-course, on-line phase and post-course (self-training phase) activities will lead to a total of 22 hours for the whole activity.</i></p> <p><i>The organizer of this activity expect that those participants who will apply for the activity are willing to and can also invest the necessary time for participating throughout the learning process of all three phases.</i></p>
<p>Assessment Strategy</p>	<p>The participants would be ask to participate in an online 12 hours course. At the course the participants will have time space to give them the opportunity to clarify any doubts regarding the content of the presentations The participants would also be ask to fulfil a questionnaire compiled by the organizing country two weeks after attending the course. To prepare themselves to fulfil the questionnaire the participants should have at least 10 hours self-training. The questionnaire should contribute to the assessment of the course quality and as a feedback for the organizing country.</p>
<p>Learning Outcomes</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Define the specifics of police/forensic activities in crime scene with occurrence or possible occurrence of CBRN materials 2. Detect, verify and distinguish possible CBRN-E threats and adapt the crime scene investigation activities with regard to specifics of the C / B / RN threat 3. Record correctly the scene and all the collected traces 4. Search, identify, select and collect with the correct procedures and methodology's all the traditional traces existing at the scene (biological, fingerprints, footprints, etc.)
